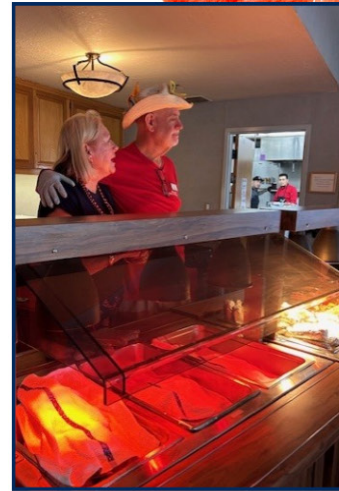


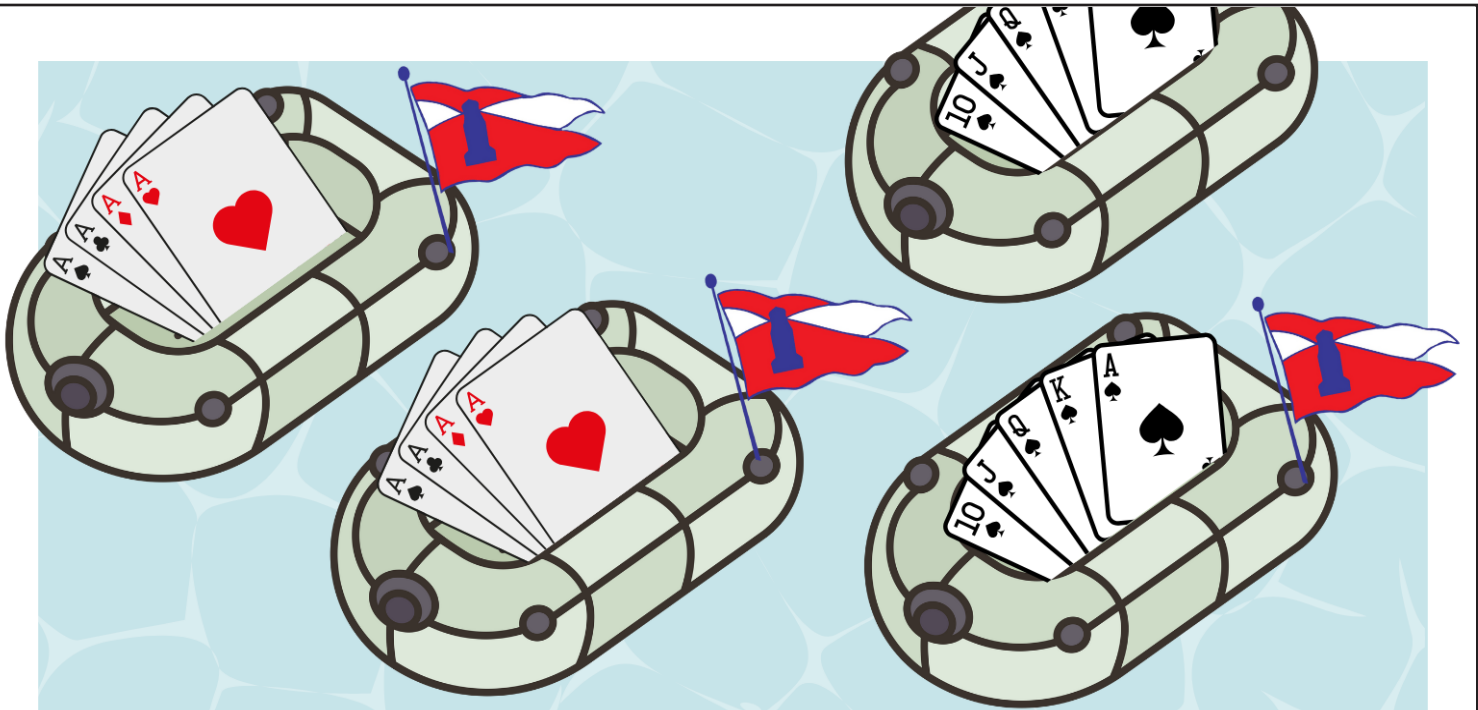
CBYC's Lobster Feast 2025

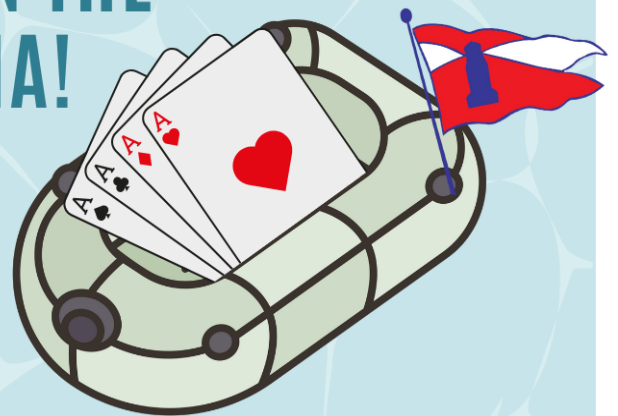

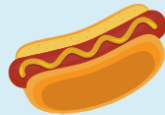

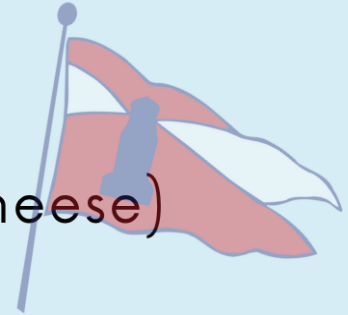

The third race is from KHYC to Shoreline Yacht Club (SYC) in Long Beach. This is the ATP #2 race, also known as the Queen Mary race.

The fourth cruise of the season was the Summer Isthmus Cruise hosted by Melissa Winter and Jim Axtell with Lisa and David Smyth. As expected, it was a well-attended and super fun event. Friday's cocktail evening with bubbly Italian inspired drinks was a great way to kick off our weekend on the "Amalfi Coast!" Summer is here!

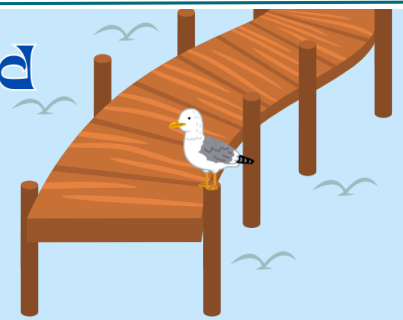
