April MIP Bio's Michael Lazzaro





RACING Recap: 2025 SCYA Mid-Winter Regatta

In late February, CBYC hosted a successful venue for the 2025 SCYA Mid-Winter Regattas. We had a great turnout in four one-design fleets including ten Cal-20s on Saturday, February 22nd. ABYC's Jeff Ives produced a wonderful writeup about Cal-20 Racing (included below).

Prior to the Cal-20 race, on the weekend of February 15, three other one-design fleets competed over two days of racing. These fleets were: International 14s, Melges 15s, and Mercurys. This race marked the 71st continuous year that CBYC has hosted the Mercury fleet for this regatta (which must be a record). The Mercury fleet winner was CBYC S/C Mike Burch on his Mercury, 'Out A Sight.' Brad Thompson of ABYC won the Melges class, and the I14s were dominated by Michael Pacholski of Kaneohe Yacht Club (yes, from Hawaii). Interestingly, Kaneohe YC will host the Cal-20 National Championship Regatta later this year.

Jeff Ives Cal-20 Wrap Up:

The motor from Long Beach was foggy, but visibility was a good mile or so. Arriving at the CBYC clubhouse it was sunny and warm at about 73 degrees. Mike Wilder was there to greet, along with Jimmy K. After rigging the boat and shoving off the dock, only one tack was needed to get to the racecourse, and the race committee had the fleet of 12 Cal 20s starting the first race right on time at 12:30.

Race #1 was two laps in about 6-8 knots of breeze and smooth water. There was sone kelp, but not too much. It was apparent coming off the start line, to tack onto port and go right and the first boat to do that was Sluggo #294, helmed by Bill Schopp. Sluggo was first to the weather mark and held that lead throughout to take the bullet. Godzilla #221 sailed by the father - son team of Jerry and Chris Vilicich was close behind for second and Teimosa #72 skippered by Kevin McCloskey, was third.

Race #2 saw the breeze increase to 8-10 knots and this time it was Godzilla taking first place. Bandini Mountain #376 sailed by Michael DeBrincat took second, with Sluggo in third.

Race #3 had white caps occasionally showing on the left side of the course and it seemed lighter on the right side. Another clean start and again very tight racing. This time, Happy Camper #372 crewed by Steve George and Kenny Dair, along with Bravura #373 sailed by Damon Kunkle and Jeff Ives, took advantage of that left side and prevailed for first and second place. Close behind for third was Bandini Mountain.

Aboard Race Committee boat Cabrillo, the PRO felt there was enough time to run a fourth race. With moderate conditions, this was a great call, as we didn't feel too tired. So the fleet was off for the fourth and final race. Again, close racing continued and it was quite a battle between Sluggo and Godzilla, with Godzilla trailing on Sluggo's transom for the final downwind leg. With maybe three hundred yards to go, Godzilla opted to jibe away onto port and go for the committee boat end of the finish line, while Sluggo held course for the pin end. It was super close as the two boats made their final push. The two crews were no doubt holding their breath, and Godzilla roared across the finish line in first by perhaps half a boat length ahead of Sluggo. What a finish!

Final results posted soon after racing with Godzilla first, Sluggo second, Bandini Mountain third, Happy Camper taking fourth, Teimosa sailing very well for 5th, Bravura in 6th, Breaking Wind #19 Gordon Leon in 7th, Groot Rooi #246 William Clark in 8th, followed by Belmar #90 Liam Haselhorst, Peppermint #1781 Richard Burns, Sanddab #1102 Larry Braslow and Cojones Grandes #27 Kevin Loper.

The Race Committee aboard the beautiful Cabrillo did an outstanding job and Gary Green was terrific keeping sailors informed prior to the race.

Moderate breeze, smooth water, warm temperature, never a powerboat wake, and friendly competition.

What a wonderful day! And, what a fun boat!
