A View From The Dock And Yard

Ahoy,

As cooler weather sets in please remember portable space heaters are a big fire safety concern. Never leave a portable space heater unattended when on. Always be sure that your heater has a safety cut-off switch if it were ever to tip over. Also, ensure that there are no flammable items near the heater when in use.



Dry Storage tenants: please check that your boat is ready for the coming rainy season. Adjust your trailer angle to allow your boat to drain. Many Cal 20's have been damaged in the past by rocking back on their trailer when filled with rainwater.

Also, Dry Storage tenants should note that their agreement with Cabrillo Landing states that the storage yard is for active users of their boats, not just a storage area. Renters that do not actively use their boats may be given a 30–day notice to vacate the yard.




